The successful candidate will work with other agencies to provide seamless care and support for our families. The role will support students to have full access to educational opportunities, overcome barriers to learning and participation and support their mental health and wellbeing by creating open dialogue with families and other professionals involved in their lives.

The main responsibilities of the role:

- To lead the team of Safeguarding and Family Support Practitioners
- To develop positive and constructive partnerships in supporting and advising families, parents, carers and students
- To support students' full access to educational opportunities and to overcome barriers to learning and participation
- To engage with local authority and community support professionals to achieve better outcomes for students and their families

- To act as one of a number of deputy designated safeguarding leads

- Excellent organisation, time and workload management under minimal day-to-day supervision and support
